INTERN OPPORTUNITIES - AGE 16 OR OLDER

Students are frequently interested in interning at a company, shadowing a medical, dental or veterinarian office or participating in research at a university. Most of these opportunities are initiated **by the student**. For example, students will reach out to their family doctor, dentist, lawyer or vet and ask if they can shadow the professional. Many departments at ASU will consider utilizing a high school student intern if a student reaches out to the professor. For example, the <u>ASU Biodesign Institute</u> utilizes high school interns. They look for high school students (age 16 or older) who have a passion for what is being done by the professor and they want to be part of it. Students, don't be afraid to reach out to professor after you have *thoroughly* researched the department and have gained some insight. You might be pleasantly surprised by the reception you receive. It's a good idea to have a resume you can send.

SOPHOMORE FIELD TRIP - University of Arizona

The University of Arizona has custom designed a field trip for our sophomore class on Wednesday, April 24th in Tucson. We will leave SPA by charter bus at 7:30 a.m. and return around 3:00/3:15 p.m. This is a great way for students to gain exposure to a college environment, learn about majors and scholarship opportunities and learn about the new Honors Village at UA. They will also possibly engage with some SPA alumni at the Honors College! There is a minimal fee of \$25 passed on to families. Lunch is provided by the University of Arizona and any special dietary restrictions should be passed on to Mrs. Sterner beforehand. Students are allowed to wear Spirit Wear and jeans or the SPA uniform. No shorts. Athletic shoes recommended for walking the campus. Payments can be made on the SPA payment portal.

Juniors and College 101

Juniors will be working on the their college application as part of College 101 in the month of April. Last month, students began brainstorming ideas for the college essay. In May, we will host a guest speaker to provide an overview on how prepare for college interviews. This month, juniors will create an account in the The Common Application and begin their application which will roll over to their senior year. The Common App recently announced that the essay prompts for 2019/2020 will remain the same from last year. Another new college application platform is the Coalition Application. The Common App is still the most popular application serving over 750 colleges. The Coalition App serves 140 colleges and it is growing. A few colleges are Coalition exclusive and these include the University of Florida, University of Virginia and the University of Washington. However, some state schools will also allow the student to apply via their own institution application. Here are the Coalition essay prompts. We utilize the Common App in College 101 because of the large number of colleges that utilize this platform including ASU and UA. **TESTING**: To meet state testing requirements, every junior will take the SAT(without writing) on Tuesday, 4/9 as part of the school day. There is no fee and tests will not be sent to a college unless the students designates it. We also recommend taking the ACT because some students may find they score higher on that test. We recommend taking one test with the additional writing option in case one of the colleges on your final list requires it. Even if your college is "test optional" meaning they do not require a standardized test for admissions, many colleges utilize these tests for placement in college level classes or for scholarships. Students who start at a community college are often asked to submit SAT or ACT tests if they transfer before completing two years of class work at the community college. Test optional colleges can be found at FairTest. Fee Waivers - Fee Waivers for standardized tests (SAT/ACT) and college application are available if a family qualifies based on significant financial need. The income guidelines are the same guidelines used by the State of Arizona for federal programs. ESEA guidelines determine eligibility. Please reach out to College Counseling if you think you may qualify so we can help you.
