A recurring point raised by our alumni was the value of SPA's Humane Letters classes as a foundation for "learning how to learn." They highlighted how the expectation to articulate ideas clearly, develop strong writing skills, and reason through complex issues with evidence has served them well in college. These skills, combined with the confidence and rhetorical abilities they gained, have helped them advocate for themselves and seize new opportunities. Even those pursuing STEM fields acknowledged the advantage their well-rounded liberal arts education provided them when compared to their college classmates.

Many of our alumni expressed the concept of delayed gratification. There were many humble admissions that they did not understand at time why they had to endure a rigorous curriculum and learn painful lessons. However, they are now extremely grateful, as the SPA experience has made their college journey, thus far, not only more manageable, but more meaningful. The scope, size, and mission of SPA compelled our graduates to participate in many varied activities and allowed them to assume leadership roles. This has translated into a much easier assimilation into the college life.

Lastly, the alumni shared reflections on the wealth of opportunities available to college students. Several of them entered college with a clear career path in mind, only to discover new passions and fields they hadn't previously considered, or even knew existed. Their advice? Stay open-minded and curious. They encouraged current students to be attentive to

experiences that resonate with them, emphasizing that the critical thinking and adaptability they cultivated at SPA have equipped them to explore diverse academic and professional avenues.
